**TINSUKIA, Aug 26:** A cancer awareness programme was held at Tinsukia College on Friday which was organized by NSS, NCC and Counselling Cell of the college in collaboration with Population Based Cancer Registry (PBCR) Dibrugarh -Upper Assam of Assam Medical College, Dibrugarh.
