The inception of Tinsukia College in the year 1956 was the result of the strenuous efforts of citizens of Tinsukia who mobilized all required resources to give rise to the great institution. The college who has completed Sixty-nine years of its glorious existence is a premier institution of higher education in the North East part of Assam catering the needs of higher education not only to the citizens of Assam but also the adjoining districts of Arunachal Pradesh. The college has made a rapid stride on the merit of its students, the dedication of the faculties and the vision of the principals. An institution which initiated its academic journey with handful of students and four faculty members has now grown into a huge family with an enrolment of more than 4,000 students and around 80 faculties contributing to the growth of this premier institution of higher education. This co-ed institution has been imparting education at all levels of education i.e. Higher Secondary, Degree & Master level respectively in 5 faculties of Arts, Science, Commerce, Management and Computer Science. Currently, the college has altogether 19 teaching department at UG level, 4 departments at Master degree levels Viz.- M. Com, M. Sc in Mathematics, M. Sc. in Chemistry and M. Sc in Computer Science. Besides, it provides two professional degree courses, Viz.- BBA and BCA. The college has also a study centre of Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University (KKHSOU) which offers several UG, PG, Diploma and Certificate programmes.

The College has State of Arts instructive to support the holistic development of the students. It has taken initiative to make the entire teaching learning process, students centric and interactive with the help of smart class rooms. The entire admission process is fully computerized which is beneficial to all stakeholders.

We hope that Tinsukia College will rise up to the expectation of all and make us all proud as stakeholder of this great institution.

## Tinsukia College-A Profile

The inception of Tinsukia College in the year 1956 was the result of the strenuous efforts of Late B. K. Saraswatji who mobilized all required resources with the help of like minded citizens of Tinsukia, a part of the then Lakhimpur District to give rise to this great institution. Without their support and patronage, the college would never have come into being. Before the college came to be located in the present premises at Kachujan, in 1961; it started out in the present premises of Senairam Higher Secondary School on 1<sup>st</sup> September, 1956. The college started as an Arts College initially at intermediate level but in the very next year Commerce stream was introduced. In 1957 itself the college was upgraded to Degree level. The year 1964 has a special significance in the annals of Tinsukia College when Science stream was also added making it a full-fledged Degree college. For an educational institution to rise to this level within a span of eight years of its inception is a feat in itself. Till 1964, courses were conducted under the auspices of Gauhati University but with the establishment of Dibrugarh University in 1965, the college was brought under its jurisdiction. Until 1961 this institution was run by the benevolent contributions of the public, but in 1962 it was accorded the status of “Deficit-in-aid” college enabling the college to receive financial grant from the Govt. of Assam. Later on in 1969, with the recognition of the University Grants Commission, New Delhi, the college became eligible for receipt of planned financial assistance for development schemes. Later the Govt. of Assam took a historic decision to provincialise all deficit grant-in-aid colleges w.e.f. 1<sup>st</sup> December 2005 and subsequently Tinsukia College enjoys the status of Provincialise College.

The college made a gradual growth on the merit of its students, the dedication of teachers and the vision of the principals. An institution which initiated its academic endeavour with handful students and four faculty members now has grown into a huge family with an enrolment of more than 3500 students and a teaching fraternity with almost 80 members contributing to the growth of this premier institution of higher education. This Co-ed institution has been imparting education both at Higher Secondary & Degree levels in 5 faculties of Arts, Science, Commerce, Management and Computer Science. Currently the college has altogether 19 departments, viz. **Assamese, Bengali, Botany, Chemistry, Commerce, Computer Science, Economics, English, Education, Geography, Hindi, History, Mathematics, Philosophy, Physics, Political Science, Sociology, Statistics and Zoology**. Besides, it provides two professional degree courses, viz, Bachelor of Business Administration (**BBA**) and Bachelor of Computer Application (**BCA**). The college has a study centre of Krishna kanta Handique State Open University under which several UG and PG courses are offered.

## INFRASTRUCTURE

The college has following Physical Infrastructure facilities:

**Tinsukia College Central Library** : The college has a central library with a stock of approximately 50000 Books including some rare publications. Besides reference books, there are a good number of Journals and Periodicals in different disciplines of Arts, Commerce, Science, General Knowledge *etc.*

**Girls Hostel:** college has a girls' hostel attached to the college campus. It is a well furnished hostel with all basic facilities. The boarding capacity of the hostel is 124 and total number of vacant seats will be available after giving accommodation to old bonafied students. The seats are allotted to the students on the basis of their merit as well as the distance from their residence. The main purpose of the hostel is to cater the needs of girls' who hail from distant and also remote areas of the tinsukia district and neighbouring states of Arunachal Pradesh.

**“Ranghar” Auditorium Hall** : There is a Auditorium Hall in the college where enable an audience to hear and watch performances at venues such as Annual Function, College Programmes *etc.*

**AC Conference Halls** : There are two Audio Visual rooms in the college where all sorts of modern facilities are available for organizing Departmental Seminars and other special lectures.

Original documents along with a set of attested documents (to be submitted) are to be brought during admission.

Admission will be purely on merit basis.

No application will be accepted after the last date fixed by the authority.

List of short listed candidates will be notified in the College Notice Board and college website.

Selected candidates must be present before Admission Committee on the date and time fixed.

Otherwise their seats will be forfeited and candidates from waiting list will be accommodated.

Students having gap year must submit an affidavit for the gap period at the time of admission.

However, anyone having a gap of more than three years will not be eligible for admission.

Any undue pressure or external interference for admission of a particular candidate will disqualify the candidate.

Any wrong information provided will automatically lead to cancellation of candidature. The College reserves the right to amend the rules & regulations wherever considered necessary and appropriate.

## SECTION 05

### Courses, Registration, Attendance, Examination, Evaluation etc.

#### **A. Attendance:**

- i. The Course Teacher shall be responsible for maintaining a record of attendance of students who have enrolled for the course.
- ii. All Course Teachers of college/institutions shall intimate the Principal/ Director of a college/ Institute through the Head of the Department concerned at least thirty calendar days before the last instruction day in the semester, the particulars of all students who have less than 80% of attendance during the total number of class days. In case of University Departments/Centre for Studies all course teachers shall intimate the Head of the Department/Chairperson of the Centre for Studies concerned at least thirty calendar days before the last instruction day in the semester, the particulars of all students who have less than 80% of attendance during the total number of class days.
- iii. A student who has less than 80% attendance in average shall not be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination. However, that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who has attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendance for valid reasons, on recommendation of the Head/Chairperson/ Principals of the Department/Centre/College on payment of a prescribed fee(s). The Head of the Departments/Chairperson of the Centre for Studies/Principals of the Colleges shall announce the names of all students who shall not be eligible to take the End semester examinations in the various Programmes and send a copy of the same to the Controller of Examinations. Such candidates shall have to repeat the concerned Course(s) when it is offered next.
- iv. A student declared as dis-collegiate shall not be allowed to proceed to the next higher Semester. He/she shall need to pursue the Semester afresh in which he/she was declared as discollegiate along with the next fresh batch.

#### **B. Examination and Evaluation:**

- a) Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis, at least two times during a Semester including the End Semester Examination.
- b) There shall be 20% marks for in-semester assessment and 80% marks for End-semester examination in each course during every semester.
- c) There shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answer-scripts

of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for re- scrutiny.

**d) In-semester Assessment:**

i. In in-semester assessment, different tools such as objective tests, written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work, etc. suitable to the courses may be employed.

ii. The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall be required to compulsorily attend in-semester assessment including appearing the sessional tests, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-semester examination. A Student cannot repeat In-semester examinations. The Department/Centre for Studies may arrange special in-semester examination whenever necessary.

**e) End Semester Examination:**

- i. There shall be one End semester examination carrying 80% Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the Course. The End semester examination is normally a written/laboratory-based examination/Project Work/Dissertation.
- ii. The Controller of Examinations shall make necessary arrangements for notifying the dates of the End semester examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar notified by the University.
- iii. The time given for End-semester examination for each Course shall be based on the credits/marks of the course.
- iv. Emphasis needs to be given on problem solving, application level questions as prescribed by National Education Policy, 2020. The question paper should include different forms of question.

**C. Results and Progression:**

- a. A candidate shall be declared as passed a Programme, provided he/she secures
  - i. At least 30% of marks in each Course in the End Semester Examinations combining both theory and practical examinations
  - ii. At least 'P' grade in the 10 point scale combining both the in-semester and End Semester Examination performance.
  - iii. There shall be no separate pass mark for In-semester Assessment.
- b. A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester/ programme, provided he/ she secures at least 'P' grade in the 10

point scale (given in clause) in all the Courses separately.

c. There may be moderation of In-semester Assessment marks/End Semester marks as and when necessary.

d. The marks of In-semester examinations obtained by the candidate shall be carried over for declaring any result.

e. A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more Courses of any end semester examinations up to fifth Semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carryover course in the next regular examinations of those courses. If a candidate fails in any of the components (either theory or practical) of a course the candidate shall have to reappear in the examination for both the components.

f. If a candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of the sixth semester examination of that candidate shall be withheld and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semesters.

g. A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of seventh semester examinations shall be provisionally promoted to the eighth semester with the failed course as carry over course(s). If a candidate clears the eight semester examination before clearing all the courses of the seventh semesters, the result of the eighth semester examination of that candidate shall be with held and his/ her results shall be announced only after he/ she clears the courses of the previous semester.

h. A student must clear all his/her Semester Examinations within six (6) years for three year undergraduate programme and seven years for four year undergraduate programme (with honours/research) from the dates of admission to the First Semester of any Programme irrespective of the number of examinations appeared by the student.

i. Since the Semester system involves continuous assessment, there shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.

j. A candidate shall be declared to have passed provided he/she has passed all the Semesters and in all the Courses separately for the concerned programme.

k. The Controller of Examinations shall declare the results of different programmes and issue Grade-sheets. The merit list shall be prepared only for the regular candidates and it does not include the backlog candidates.

l. The first rank holder of a programme shall be decided on the

basis of the CGPA. However, the Overall Weighted Percentage of Marks (OWPM) of a candidate shall be considered in case of tie in CGPA.

m. Results of the candidates appeared in the Betterment or Backlog Examinations shall not be counted for the award of Prizes/Medals, Rank or Distinction.

#### **D. Grading System:**

a. The absolute grading system shall be applied in evaluating performance of the 21 students.

b. The following scale of grading system shall be applied to indicate the performances of students in terms of letter grade and grade points as given below:

#### **a. Computation of SGPA and CGPA: The procedure to compute the SGPA and CGPA are given below**

- i. The SGPA is the ratio of the sum of the products of the number of credits with the grade points scored by a student in all the courses taken by a student and the sum of the number of credits off all the courses undergone by a student.

$$SGPA(S_i) = \frac{\sum C_i G_i}{\sum C_i}$$

Where  $C_i$  is the number of credit of the  $i$ th course and  $G_i$  is the grade point scored by the student in the  $i$ th course.

The SGPA and CGPA shall be rounded off to two decimal points and reported in the transcripts.

- i. **Conversion of CGPA in to percentage (%):** CGPA will be multiplied by 10.  
Percentage of marks = (CGPA X 10)
- ii. The Letter grade 'B+ ' and above shall be considered as First Class and Letter grade 'B' shall be considered as Second Class.
- iii. A student is considered to have completed a course successfully and earned the prescribed credits if he/she secures a letter grade other than F (Failed) or 'Abs' (Absent/Incomplete).
- iv. If a candidate secures 'F' grade in a Course, he/she shall have to reappear in the Course in the next legitimate chance.
- v. If a student secures 'F' grade in Project Work/ Dissertation/ assignment etc., he/she shall have to re-submit it after necessary revisions. The Result shall be declared with next regular batch.

- vi. **'Abs'** grade shall be awarded to a candidate if he/she has not fulfilled the following requirements:
1. If a candidate fails to appear in any Course(s) in an end semester examination.
  2. If a candidate fails to submit the project work/dissertation / assignment of an end semester examination.
  3. If a candidate is certified as not eligible to appear in any course(s) in an end semester examination by the Course Teacher(s) due to insufficient attendance in lectures, tutorials practical or fieldworks.
- vii. The candidates not appearing in a Semester Examination shall be considered as an **'Abs'** candidate and that will be reflected in the Grade Sheet of the candidate. These candidates shall have to convert the **'Abs'** grade by appearing in the next examination on the Course (provided he/ she has legitimate chance to appear the Course) concerned or by submitting project work/dissertation/ assignment etc.
