## **Section One**

# Tinsukia College — A Profile

The inception of Tinsukia College in the year 1956 was the result of the strenuous efforts of late B.K. Saraswatji who mobilised all required resources with the help of like minded citizens of Tinsukia, a part of the then Lakhimpur District to give rise to this great institution. Without their support and patronage, the college would never have come into being. Before the college came to be located in the present premises at Kachujan, in 1961; it started out in the present premises of Senairam Higher Secondary School on 1st September 1956. The college was started as an Arts college initially at Intermediate level but in the very next year Commerce stream was also introduced. In 1957 itself the college was upgraded to Degree level. The year 1964 has a special significance in the annals of Tinsukia College when Science stream was also added making it a full-fledged multi-faculty Degree college. For an institution to rise to this level within 8 years of its inception is a feat in itself. By 1964, the college conducted courses under the auspices of Gauhati University but after establishment of Dibrugarh University in 1965, it was brought into the jurisdiction of the said University. The college had been running on public contributions and generous donations from philanthropists till 1961; but in 1962 the college was accorded the status of "Deficit Grant-in-Aid" college which enabled it to receive financial grants from the Govt. of Assam. Later on in 1969, the college was recognised by the University Grants Commission, New Delhi which resulted into receipt of planned financial assistance from UGC for various development schemes. Few years back, the Govt. of Assam took a historic decision to provincialise all deficit grant-in-aid colleges w.e.f. 1st December 2005, the college enjoys the status of 'Provincialised College'.

The college grew from strength to strength on the merit of its students, the dedication of its teachers & the vision of the principals. An institution which began its academic endeavour with handful students and four faculties; has currently a student enrollment of more than 2, 500 & permanent and contractual faculty strength of more than 80. This Co-ed institution has been imparting education both at Higher Secondary & Degree levels in 5 faculties of Arts, Science, Commerce, Management and Computer Science. It has altogether 17 Regular teaching departments and 2 professional degree and a number of certificate courses with Krisnakanta Handique State Open University Study Centre offering a wide range of choice to students. The college has an infrastructure built on a sprawling campus covering an area of about 18 bighas. The facilities includes a big library, well stocked with Books & Journals, Photocopiers, Computers, Well equipped laboratories, Girls' hostel, Career Information and Guidance Cell, Media Centre, a Canteen, Canopy etc. As per the recommendations of NAAC an "Internal Quality Assurance Cell" has also been established to improve the quality of education and support services offered by the college to its stake holders.

In response to the evolving needs of the students and economy for market oriented professional courses, the college has initiated necessary steps to start professional academic programmes. As a result in 2005 the college managed to establish the 'Centre for Management Education' to launch 3 years BBA course under Dibrugarh University. The BCA course has also been started under Dibrugarh University, since 2009.

The college has produced illustrious alumni who have occupied distinguished positions in various spheres and are eloquent testimony to the caliber of education imparted by this college. They are eminent Scientists, Industrialists, Academicians, Politicians, Corporate heads, Doctors, Engineers, Chartered Accountants, Lawyers, Writers, Artists and Performing artistes. The college has a permanent alumni association which has initiated several steps for the all round development of the college. Notable among them is the construction of the biggest auditorium in Upper Assam and contributions to some other valuable things, etc.

Since the demand for quality education is growing leaps & bounds, there is an urgent necessity to upgrade the present infrastructure of the college. Sensing the winds of change, the Governing Body of the college has constructed the state-of-the-art library building. The college has a vibrant study centre for Krishna Kanta Handiqui State Open University with a huge number of learners offering 3 (Three) years Degree courses of BA, B.COM, BBA, BCA, BMC with BPP (12 months) and M.A. in Pol. Science, English, Sociology & Assamese, MSW and D.EL.Ed. for drop outs, employees, house-wives or students of regular College courses and TET teachers. A new Girls' Hostel building is under process of construction. DST-FIST project was done for Science Departments with its equipment and support aid to laboratories for worth of Rs. 50 lacs. Science departments are upgraded with modern equipments. New efforts are given to develop and extend the infrastructure in every sphere of the college.

Completed forms accompanied by necessary documents are to be submitted to the college office during working hours. No application shall be received after the last date 1.3

Selection is made purely on merit basis. Candidates may be called to appear in a written test also. The list of the selected candidates shall be put on the notice boards & they 1.4

would not be intimated individually.

Enlisted Candidate will be called for interview /Counselling on the date & venue to be declared by the concerned authority. Important to note that Selected candidates shall 1.5 have to get themselves admitted on the same day of the interview / counselling, otherwise their seats will be forfeited on that very day and pass on to the candidates of waiting list as also prepared on merit basis.

Candidate in the waiting list will be called for interview, in the same day fixed for admission and Vacant seats will be filled up from the candidates in the waiting list as per merit. 1.5

Candidates are required to produce the following documents at the time of interview/ 1.7 counselling.

Original copies of Marksheets, Pass Certificates, Admit Card / Age Certificate of the

last qualifying examination and Character Certificate.

Original copies of Caste Certificates issued by competent authority in case of iil reserved seats.

Students passing the qualifying examination with a year or more gap, shall have to submit a 'Gap Certificate' from institution last attended or a Govt. Gazetted iiil Officer testifying to his / her activities during the interim period or by giving a court affidavit (Candidate having more than 3 years study gap will not be eligible for admission) whereever necessary.

One set of attested copies of all original testimonials.

Any pressure or interference from any quarters for the admission of a particular student 1.8 will disqualify the candidate.

A photo Identity Card will be provided to the students after their enrolment into the programme. The enrolled students are required. to produce the identity card as & when required.

### A) ARTS - GRADUATE PROGRAMME UNDER SEMESTER SYSTEM:

 There shall be a course of study of Three Years duration leading to the Degree of Bachelor of Arts. It is consisted of six semesters.

Eligibility criterion: A student who has passed the Higher Secondary Examination (10 + 2) is of the Assam Higher Secondary Education Council / CBSE or an equivalent examination (10 + 2) recognized as such by the University, shall be eligible for the admission into the first Semester of the Six-Semester Degree Course in Arts in University semester system.

- 4] Skill based courses: A skill based courses shall be mandatory for all students pursuing General B.A. programme.

### **B**: ACADEMIC SCHEDULE:

The Academic Schedule for the B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. programmes in the Semester system shall be administered by the Academic Calender of the University published for every academic session.

# C: PROGRAMME REGISTRATION:

- ☐ The candidates shall have to register themselves to the University during stipulated time after admission clearly mentioning their course / subject combinations.
- ☐ The colleges / institutes concerned shall submit to the University the detailed Registration List of their enrolled students using the software provided by the University within one month from the date of admission or as prescribed in the University Academic Calender.
- □ The students registered by the University as per the information provided by the colleges / institutes shall be treated as final. In no circumstances, change of subject combination and switching from major programme to general programme and vise-versa shall be
- ☐ There shall be no provision for giving permission for additional admission by the University for admission after submission of detailed Registration List of their enrolled students by the colleges / institutes concerned to the University.

### D: ATTENDANCE

- A student who has less than 80% attendance shall be permitted to sit for the End-semester examination in the course in which the shortfall exists.
  - Provided that it shall be open to the University to grant exemption to a student who was attended a minimum of 70% classes but failed to obtain the prescribed 80% attendence for valid reasons on recommendation of the Head / Director / Coordinator of the Department / Centre on payment of a prescribed non collegiate fee (s).
- The Principal of the college / institute with recommendation of the Heads of the iii Departments shall announce the names of all students who shall not be eligible to appear in the End-semester examinations in the various courses due to non-fulfilment of the criteria of internal assessment and attendance, and send a copy of the same to the University. In such cases, the student shall have to re-enroll in the relevant course(s) with the next batch freshly.

## **E: EXAM AND EVALUATION**

- Examination and evaluation shall be done on a continuous basis. al
- There shall be 20% marks for internal assessment in both Theory and Practical Papers bì



except Environmental Science and Multi-Disciplinary and 80% marks for End-Semester examination in each course during every semester.

As per University rules there shall be no provision for re-evaluation of the answerscripts of the end-semester examinations. However, a candidate may apply for rescrutiny.

#### Internal Assessment:

- In internal assessment, different tools may be employed such as written tests, assignments, paper presentation, laboratory work etc. suitable to the courses. The Procedure for Internal Assessment is prescribed in rules I.
- The students shall be informed in advance about the nature of assessment. Students shall compulsorily attend internal assessment, failing which they will not be allowed to appear for the End-Semester examination. A Student cannot repeat In-semester examinations. However if a student fails to appear in any of the in-sem. examinations on valid reasons, the department may arrange special in-semester examination whenever necessary.

### **End Semester Examination:**

- There shall be one End semester examination carrying 80% Marks in each course of a Semester covering the entire syllabus prescribed for the course. The End semester examination is normally a written / laboratory-based examination / Project Work / Dissertation.
- The Controller of Examinations shall then make necessary arrangement for notifying the dates of the end semester examinations and other procedures as per Dibrugarh University Rules (at least 20 days in advance) and the Academic Calendar notified by the University.
- Normally, the end-semester examination for each course shall be of three hour duration.
- Setting of question papers, moderation of question papers, evaluation of answer scripts, scrutiny, tabulation of marks, etc. and announcement of results, shall be governed by the Dibrugarh University Examination Ordinance 1972 (as amended uptodate).

#### **Practical Examination:**

Practical Examinations of a Semester shall normally be held prior to the End Semester Examinations.

#### **Betterment Examination:**

- A student shall be entitled to take the "betterment Examinations" in any two theory courses of any of the six semesters after passing the Sixth Semester examination only once. In this case, the higher marks secured by the student shall be retained. The candidates shall have to apply for betterment examination within one year of passing the Sixth Semester examination.
  - No betterment shall be allowed in the practical examinations.
- The state of the course of operation of these regulations relating to holding the state of the Dibrugarh University.

#### HITTE SHITT DROGRESSION .

- At least 30% marks in the course in the End Semester Exam. i.e. subject to 30% marks in the course is the aggregate of the In-semester & end-semester examinations.
- A candidate shall be declared as passed a semester, provided he / she passes all the subjects of a semester independently.



c] The marks of in-semester examination shall be carried over to the next examination in which he/she was absent or failed for declaring any result.

A candidate who fails or does not appear in one or more courses of any end-semester examination upto sixth semester shall be provisionally promoted to the next higher semester with the failed course as carry over course (s). Such candidates will be eligible to appear in the carry over course(s) in the next regular exminations of those courses. However, the following restrictions shall be applicable:

i) A student must cleared all his/her semester exam. within 6 (six) years from the date of admission to the 1st semester of any programme irrespectiv of the number of exams. appeared by the student, viz.1st and 2nd sem. shall have six consecutive chances, 3rd and 4th sem. shall have 5 (five) consecutive chances, 5th and 6th sem. shall have 4 (four) consecutive chances to clear end sem. examinations.

ii) If a candidate clears the sixth semester examination before clearing all the courses of the previous semesters, the result of the sixth semester examination of that candidate shall be kept withheld and his / her results shall be announced only after he / she clears the courses of the previous semesters.

e] A candidate may be allowed for college transfer only once during the whole programme.

A student must pass all his/her semester examinations within 6 years from the date of admission (registration) to the first semester course.

g] There shall be no scope for a student to appear as a private candidate in any programme in this system.

h] The degree shall be awarded to each candidate who has passed the three year degree programme in the following manner.

#### G: GENERAL:

For any matter not covered under these Regulations, the Dibrugarh University Regulations BA / B.Sc. / B.Com. Programmes in the Semester System, 2010, the existing Dibrugarh Theresity Rules, Ordinances and the Dibrugarh University Act, 1965 (as amended) shall be applicable.

#### H - SKILL-BASED COURSE :

Skill-based courses are proposed to be designed for the General B.A. and B.Sc. programmes, which shall be offered during the fifth and sixth semesters as compulsory subjects. The primary objective for introducing these courses are to provide knowledge and skills on certain specific areas, where a student can find their suitable professions in both employment or entrepreneuship sectors after being graduated. It is also expected that these courses shall be able to reduce the gap between the society's expectation for empowered educated youth and crowledge-centric products of the University. As per the Dibrugarh University Regulations for the B.A. / B.Sc. / B.Com. Programmes in the Semester System, 2010, "A skill based course shall be mandatory for all students pursuing General B.A. and B.Sc. Programmes. The colleges shall offer the Skill-based Courses as per their own infrastructure and human resource feasibility. The college will teach computer skill as compulsory subject according to programme. Tourism and Travel Management for Arts and Vermicomposting for Science will be taught in skill-bessed courses as per programme by Tinsukia College.

### L RULES FOR INTERNAL ASSESSMENT IN B.A./B.SC./B.COM. PROGRAMMES IN SEMESTER SYSTEM:

The marks alloted for Internal Assessment (20%) in each course shall be based on the following:

Sessional Examination-I (Written & Practical)- 25% of the marks alloted for internal

Sessional Examination-II (Written & Practical)- 25% of the marks alloted for internal assesment.

Seminar/Group Discussion- 25% of the marks alloted for internal assessment.

Attendance: 25% of the marks allotted for Internal Assessment. The marks for Internal Assessment for attendance shall be awarded as follows:

Sessional examination shall be conducted by the concerned teacher(s) of the course. The setting of question paper, invigilating duty, evaluation of answerscripts for each paper shall be done by the concerned teacher(s) as a part of his/her/their normal duty. The teacher concerned shall fix the date of the sessional examination of each course complying with the Academic Calendar of the University. The students shall have to write the answers in the scripts provided and duly authenticated by the college/institute concerned. 33

- 3. After evaluation, the answerscripts should be shown to the students and corrections should be made if necessary. After this, the answer scripts should be collected back from the students.
- 4. There shall be no provision for "repeat"/"betterment" in the sessional examination. If a student misses any sessional examination for unavoidable reasons, the concerned teacher may allow the student to appear in a separate examination at his/her own discretion.
- 5. The marks of internal assessment secured by a candidate shall be carried over to next legitimate chances by the University.
- 6. If a course is taught by more than one teacher then the concerned teachers shall combinely conduct the process of internal assessment.
- 7. If any student fails to appear in internal assessment, he/she shall not be eligible to appear in the end semester examinations of the course(s) concerned. The colleges/institutes shall notify the same prior to filling up forms for examinations.
- 8. At the end of the semester (before the end-semester examinations begin) the concerned college shall submit the internal assessment marks in proper mark sheets to the University. The University may call the answerscripts from the colleges/institutes at any time during the academic sessions.

The new CBCS Course will be started from 2017 1st June as per UGC Notification and Dibrugarh University regulations.

#### 7.3 THE CENTRAL LIBRARY

The college has a central library with a present stock of approximately 50,000 books including some rare publications. Besides reference books there are a good no. of research journals & periodicals in different disciplines of Arts, Science & Commerce, General knowledge etc. The individual teaching departments also have their own departmental libraries. Rules and regulations relating to Central Library are as follows:

## 7.3.1 RULES & REGULATIONS OF THE CENTRAL LIBRARY: Working hrs. – 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. (ON ALL WORKING DAYS)

- 1.1 Every person who enters the library shall have to sign the register at gate and adhere to rules of the library.
- 1.2 Each and every reader of the library should be well behaved and sober.
- 1.3 Readers / borrowers shall keep silence within the library premises.
- 1.4 Using of Cell phone is strictly prohibited within the library premises and also in the classes.
- 1.5 Students must produce their identity card and library card at the time of borrowing books from the library and the teachers should produce their pass books at the time of borrowing and returning books.
- 1.6 A borrower shall be held responsible for any damage or loss of book (s) in his / her possession.
- No personal belongings except small purses shall be allowed to be carried with the readers beyond main do or of the library. Bags and goods are to be kept in goods counter taking token.
- 1.8 Normally book (s) are issued for 14 (fourteen) days only, however a book may be reissued for another 7 (seven) days by the librarian.
- 1.9 If the books are not returned or reissued on the due date, overdue charge for 50 paise per day will be charged for the period the books are kept beyond the date.
- 2.0 Reference books, rare books, periodicals and books of the fine Arts and Maps / Globes, question paper books are not to be issued.
- 2.1 In case any book is lost or damaged by the borrower, the borrower shall have to replace the book or pay the cost replacement. If the book is one of a set of volumes, the borrower may be asked to replace the whole set.
- In case of the loss of a library card, the card-holder must report immediately to the librarian who will issue a fresh card after a satisfactory explanation and payment of Rs. 30.00 for the duplicate library card to college-office counter.
- 2.3 A borrower is strongly advised to check books before getting issued, if any mutilation or marking is found it should be pointed out immediately to the issue counter assistant to put into record such defects etc. Otherwise the borrower shall be responsible for any mutilation.
- 2.4 The library card is not transferable. Borrowing a book against other's card is not permissible.


